Those of you who are applying to any private colleges/universities must remember to keep track of the important deadlines that you have coming up within the next few months. Many of these colleges will require you to get a letter of recommendation from a teacher and/or counselor. It's important that you give your teachers/coaches/counselors at least two weeks notice.


Financial Aid

Before Beginning Your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) you need to know:

- You cannot submit your application until January 1, 2012
- You will need to gather your social security number, and your parents 2011 tax returns
- Go to fafsa.gov and print a FAFSA on the Web Worksheet to familiarize yourself with the process of filling it out

ALL Seniors should apply for financial aid regardless of where they will be attending college after their high school graduation. Even if you do not qualify for free money, you will be put on different college lists for possible scholarships. Counselors will be working with both students and parents to assist them through the financial aid process.

A Financial Aid Workshop for your parents is scheduled for Wednesday, February 1 from 6:30 - 8:00. The workshop will be offered by representatives from the *University of California Irvine*. They will help parents understand the financial aid process and review the steps necessary in filling out the FAFSA. The workshop will be presented in English, Vietnamese, and Spanish.

Apply for financial aid January 1, 2012 - March 2, 2012.

The counselors will be hosting Financial Aid Workshops with the students in **January** during the school day. During this time we will be reviewing the financial aid process and introducing the students to the FAFSA website.

Cal Grant A (tuition and fees at public or private colleges)

In order to be eligible for any of the financial aid opportunities listed above students must:

1) File a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) www.fafsa.gov

2) Release your GPA Verification Form to the counseling office

TIPS FOR GETTING STARTED EARLY

- Turn in your GPA Verification Form with parent signature to Mr.Tran ASAP. If you have misplaced the form stop by the guidance office to pick up a new one.
- Apply for a PIN number. The student and one parent will be required to get a pin number in order to electronically sign your FAFSA form. You can do so by accessing **www.pin.ed.gov**
- Gather all the things that you will need to successfully complete the FAFSA form:
 - Social Security Number (including your parents'
 - Driver's License Number (if you have one)
 - 2011 Federal Tax Information or tax return
 - Records of untaxed income, such as Social Security Benefits, Welfare Benefits, and Veterans Benefits

Private College and Out-of State College Applications FAQ

Q: How do I apply to private or out-of-state colleges?

A: Many private colleges use the common application (www.commonapp.org). Some private and out-of-state schools use their own applications. Please check the college websites to see which type of application they accept.

Q: What is the deadline to apply?

A: Colleges have various deadlines, please check their websites. Many colleges have deadlines in January, so it's not too late. Please visit La Quinta's homepage to download a list of California private college deadlines and minimum requirements.

Q: How do I obtain a fee waiver for private or out-of-state schools?

A: If you qualified for a SAT fee waiver then you also qualify for a fee waiver for private and out-of-state schools. You may pick up a CollegeBoard Request for Waiver of College Application Fee from your counselor. You may only use this fee waiver if the college you are applying to accepts it. Some colleges use other types of fee waivers.

Q: Is there a limit on the number of Fee Waivers for private or out-of-state colleges?

A: No, you may have a fee waiver to each private or out-of-state college you apply to.

O: What is our CEEB code?

A: La Quinta's School Code is 053737

Q: How do I request recommendations and Secondary School Reports from counselors?

A: Ask your counselor first and provide them a resume or "brag" sheet. Then send them a link to complete your forms electronically. Here is a list of counselor emails:

How to Apply for Scholarships

WHAT ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS?

Few scholarships will find their way to you. In the majority of cases you must look for them yourself. While many scholarships are available, their requirements vary greatly. Applying for scholarships takes work. Time has to be devoted to researching different kinds of scholarships. Not all scholarships require strong GPA's. Many scholarships require membership in service organizations or involvement in community and extracurricular activities. The trick is to find a scholarship that fits you.
